Blaine Bettinger, the Genetic Genealogist, is well known in the genealogical community for his expertise at the intersection of traditional genealogical techniques and modern genetic research. Dr. Bettinger is a professional genealogist specializing in the use of DNA evidence to solve difficult problems.

Blaine co-authored, with Debbie Parker Wayne, *Genetic Genealogy in Practice*, used this year as a guide in GRIVA's DNA SIG. He is also the author of *The Family Tree Guide to DNA Testing and Genetic Genealogy*. One of the first bloggers in the field, he maintains *The Genetic Genealogist* <thegeneticgenealogist.com> where he shares the latest news and developments in the field of genetic genealogy and personal genomics. He can also be found at Facebook.

Genealogists have taken his courses at IGHR (Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research), SLIG (Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy), GRIP (Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh), and VIGR (Virtual Institute of Genealogical Research). He lectures at national, state, and local conferences, and has contributed to popular, genealogical, and genetic articles.

Blaine is a graduate of ProGen Study Group 21, a trustee for the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society's Board of Trustees, and a board member for the Association of Professional Genealogists.

He earned his J.D. from Syracuse University School of Law. His practice focuses on patents, copyrights, and trademarks. He earned his Ph.D. in Biochemistry with a concentration in genetics from the State University of New York, Upstate Medical University.
